Four Sundays when we prepare for the birth of Jesus	<b>violet</b> , a deep bluish red (often mistakenly called "purple") symbolizing mourning and penance.	<b>Advent</b>
From Christmas to the Baptism of the Lord we celebrate Immanuel, God with us, the Word made flesh	<b>white</b> , symbolizing purity and joy.	<b>Christmas</b>
Until Lent begins on Ash Wednesday	<b>green</b> , symbolizing life and hope	<b>Ordinary</b>
40 days of preparation for Christ's Passion and death	<b>violet</b> , a deep bluish red (often mistakenly called "purple") symbolizing mourning and penance.	<b>Lent</b>
Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday	<b>red</b> , the color of passion, is used on Passion (Palm) Sunday and Good Friday	<b>Triduum</b>
Easter Sunday to Pentecost we celebrate Christ's resurrection and the life of the early Christian Church	<b>white</b> , symbolizing purity and joy. Red, symbolizing fire, is also used on Pentecost Sunday.	<b>Easter</b>
Until the first Sunday of Advent	<b>green</b> , symbolizing life and hope	<b>Ordinary</b>
